Where appropriate, does the yearbook include information about other chapter activities such as planning sessions, fund raisers, and social events? (15%) 5. Was the yearbook itself creatively done and well constructed with an attractive layout and an inviting cover? (10%)

Does the newsletter keep chapter members informed about upcoming chapter, regional, and international activities and programs? (30%) 2. Does the newsletter keep members informed about completed chapter, regional, and international activities? (25%); 3. Is the newsletter easy-to-read and easy to find information? (20%); 4. Is the newsletter well-written and engaging? (15%) 5. Does the technical quality of the writing and editing reflect well on the chapter? (10%)

## Entry Specifications

In an essay of 500 words or fewer describe your chapter's goals for its newsletter and how you believe your newsletter met those goals. Indicate in your essay how many issues of the newsletter were published and, by category, to whom they were sent (e.g., to members, all chapters in the region, regional officers, etc.). Your entry must be accompanied by one copy of each issue published since the last Regional Convention.

Content criteria include how completely the site covers the chapter and its activities (15 pts); how accurate and current the information is (15 pts); how effectively the site encourages existing members to participate and new members to join (15 pts); and how well the site reflects Phi Theta Kappa's hallmarks (15 pts). Design criteria include a consistent and pleasing appearance (10 pts); technical excellence - pages load quickly, internal links all work, usable at 640x480 and 256 colors, compatible with Netscape 4.x and Internet Explorer 4.x, and effective use of features (10 pts); ease of navigation (10pts); and how well the site functions as a coherent whole, giving the user a complete experience centered around you (10 pts).
